

AT WORK PROJECT COMES TO AN END

Conferences in the European cities of, Bucharest, Graz, Glasgow, Lodz and Madrid to disseminate the results of this Erasmus+ Project

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
During August and September 2019, final conferences were held in the cities of Bucharest, Glasgow, Graz, Lodz and Madrid and to disseminate the results of the Erasmus + project: **AT WORK- ICT BASED EVALUATION METHODOLOGY TO ASSESS THE SOCIAL IMPACT OF WORK-LINKED.**

The conferences were organized by the Consortium of this European project: the 3s Research laboratory-Forschungsverein companies in Austria; 36.6 Competence Center, from Poland, Glasgow Clyde College, from the United Kingdom and the Dramblys and Employment Agency organizations of Madrid, from Spain

The first of the events took place on 5 August in the city of Graz, home of the ISOP Innovative Spezialprojekte GmbH. It was organized by the Austrian partner 3s Research Laboratory. The event was held at the VET specialist institutions and 11 people attended (four qualifying experts and seven trainers. The results of the At Work project were presented by Anathol Rathbauer and Janine Wulz from 3s research laboratory.

On 23 August the AT WORK final conference was organized by the Glasgow Clyde College, at the Double Tree Hilton in Glasgow. Jim Anderson, Head of External Funding of this academic institution and participant in the Consortium of the draft presented the results of the project. The event was attended by 31 participants from outside the College plus a number of people from the College interested in the project.

The Polish city of Lodz was the scene of the two final conferences organized by 36.6 Competence center, the Polish partner of the Consortium on 7 and 13 September. The first event, a practical workshop on the AT WORK platform was held at the Faculty of Management in the University of Lodz, and the second one was held at the Lodz Art Factory.



The results of At Work were presented, in the first conference, by the IT expert and owner of Done e-creative solutions Robert Papis, and Artur Janusz, Senior Lecturer at the University of Lodz and, in the second event, by Dorota Wodnica, Director of the Department of Culture and Education at Marchal's Office in Lodz and Anna Soltys, President of the Foundation of Social Trust-Publica Fides, specializing in the implementation. In total, 40 participants attended (20 at each event)

On 26 and 27 September, the At Work final conference organized by the Romanian partner National Scientific Research Institute for Labour and Social Protection (INCSMPS) was held at a well-known hotel in Bucharest.

The two-day conference was attended by 60 stakeholders. The second day conference was broadcast live via www.cableeuropeana.ro, a Media partner of INCSMPS. Thus, the event reached 9267 people and had 2467 views.

Finally, on 27 September, the organizations DRAMBLYS and Agencia para el Empleo de Madrid (AE), also presented the results of this Erasmus+ project at an event held in the Economy, Innovation and Employment Department Assembly Hall. It was attended by 31 Representatives of Vocational Training Centres, plus AE staff. Prior to the event, an invitation was sent by the AE General Manager to 275 stakeholders. The speakers at this Final Conference, included, Miguel Massigoge Galbis, Training Advisor at Possible, SI, who delivered a speech entitled "The importance of assessing the quality and impact on training" and Dramblys CEO, Amaia San Cristobal, who presented the AT WORK Methodology and the Assessment Platform.

The participants in each of the aforementioned events, showed great interest in this innovative tool and welcomed this European initiative.

ATWORK EVALUATION FRAMEWORK TO ASSESS THE SOCIAL IMPACT OF THE WORK-LINKED TRAINING
